New Business:

- * Check out the Web Page for the events scheduled for this year.
- * Lorin reported we have two club trainers, one at Greg's house and the other at Al's house.
- * Sandy from the Veteran's home. Al presented a check for \$250 for the Retsil Veteran's home. The money was raised by donations from club members.

Sandy is the activity manager, she stated every penny of donations go directly to

residents. The residents of the Veteran's home vote for how the money will be used.

The Veteren's home is now approved for medicare aid.

*Lori is from the County Parks Dept. Everyone in the club needs to register as a volunteer. What it is for is if you are injured as a volunteer, then you cannot sue the county parks dept. It also pays for medical injuries your insurance does not cover. It also may provide liability protection for you. This does not pertain to flying activities, but it does pertain to site improvement, such as work parties.

You only have to sign this once. You cannot do any work at the site without signing up.

This is important as the County Commissioners do not realize how many hours we put in to improving the county park. This is important as the more hours are put in, the more chance we have of obtaining grants. Last year, we qualified for \$19.50 per hour of work we did. She's not sure of the rate for this year.

- *Need volunteers for April and May Open Shops.
- *Last month, we had 13 people for the Saturday breakfast. Come on out and enjoy the fun!
- *Shuswap caravan plans are forming, please contact Al for more information. This is the Float Fly in Canada. Leave Sept 5th, come back on Sept 15th. Make plans now.
- *Paul suggested instead of an R/C airfield, we have an R/C Hobby Park to include R/C boats, U-Control planes in gravel pit. We have a better chance of retaining the park.

- *Al spoke with Electric Boat Clubs and their excited about the concept of an R/C Hobby Park at our site.
- *To qualify for our Gold Leader Club, we need to pay attention to our noise level. Nothing over 95 dbas at the Mutliwing event. Al would like to have the 95 dbas level enforced by mid year this year or beginning of next year. Al has a dba meter.
- *Al stated the prize for Mozettlan has been canx for next year. However, there will be another equally as good prize to be announced.
- *Corky encouraged everyone to come out for Combat this year. If you can fly within the boundaries, your good enough for flying combat. Corky showed his cool looking combat plane and stated anyone who wanted to fly combat can have the plane for \$10.
- *Brain offered a gutter snipe for free for anyone who wants to fly Combat. One condition, you need to use it for flying combat and you have to fly it in combat this year. Verlyn took it.
- *Al gave Corky his plaque for first place in Combat. Boots received 2nd place Combat. Sam received 3rd place Combat.
- *Combat is scheduled for the airshow in case we need it for a rain day.
- *Al asked if anyone wants to be a CD for the air show, open house. If no CD volunteers, the air show will be canx.

- *We will need a work party soon. Date will come up.
- *New flight stations are needed.
- *Runway Project: Verlyn has found a local company who has the same material we have been using. It will cost us \$1,600 plus tar and staples. Total, approx \$2,000. The material is located in Tacoma, we can get it the day after we order it.

Al asked if any objections to replace the runway by using the above info? No objections were presented. Work on a new runway will take 2-3 days to install, maybe more.

- *Expo report: Big items didn't sell as well as smaller items. Smaller items sold well.
- *Verlyn did a write up for the AMA magazine for the Multiwing Event for 2008. It was in the March 2009 edition.
- *Verlyn found a lake, just south of the airfield. Possible six summer cabins there. Verlyn found the owner of the lake and the property, it needs further research.
- *Al's wife is coming down with Dementia. If you call Al and he doesn't return a call,

please call again (he didn't get the message).

- * Crocker Lake was taken out of the Calendar as nobody went last year.
- *The Safety Officer (Rick) reviewed the Safety Rules for the club. Among the rules, no flying alone. If someone is seriously injured. One person stays with the injured person, another person will go the Glenwood Firestation for help in the event that the cell phones are not working at the field.
- *April 25th possible swap meet. Our club will have priority for tables, other clubs may come if we have enough tables. \$5.00 for a center table and \$10 for wall tables. \$5.00 for outside on the lawn. This is at the Community Center. We can serve coffee, donuts, cookies and pies for a fee. Need volunteers to help run it. The club decided not to have the Swap Meet.
- *We will still have club swap meet in June.
- *Armed Forces day parade is on May 16th, same day as Multiwing Event.
